The class officers were as follows, President---Dorothy Ping, Vice-President---Freddie Stuart, Secretary and Treasurer---Beverly Jean Welch.

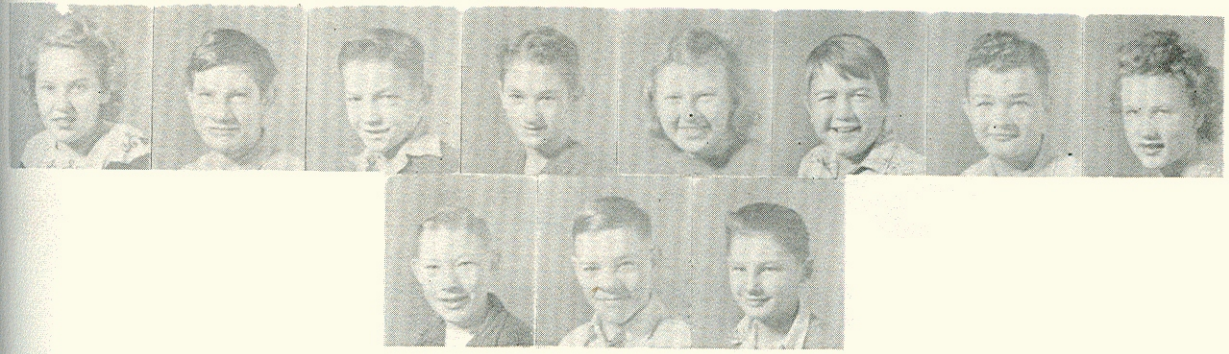
The attendants to the King and Queen of the Freshman class were Freddie Stuart, and Dorothy Ping.

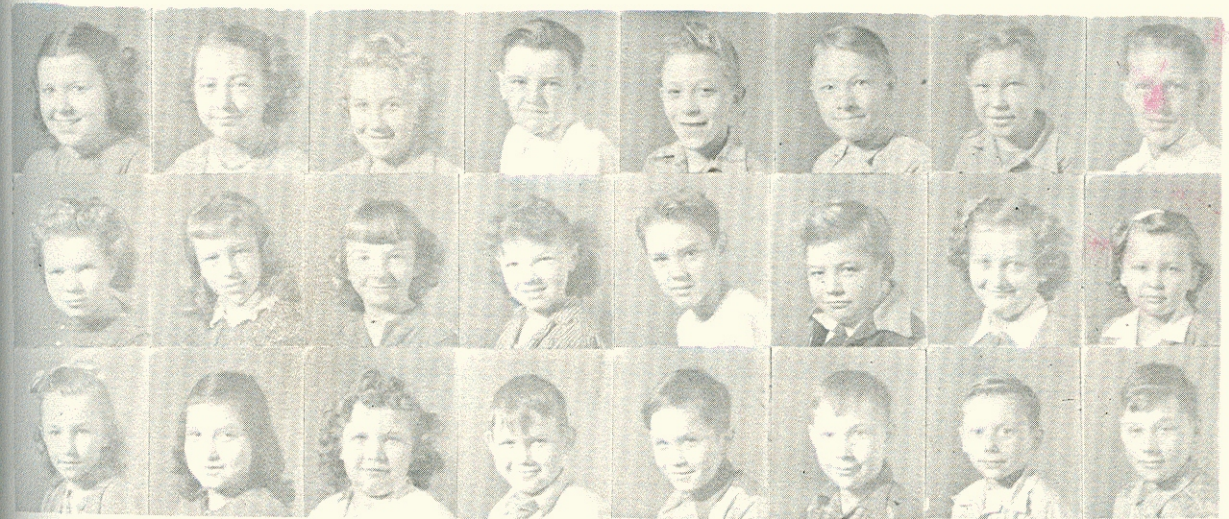
Harold Welch and Fritz Kirsch were the only Freshmen boys that went out for basketball.

Galin Lahmen was elected Cheerleader, but found farming more interesting, so Dorothy Ping took his place as cheerleader.

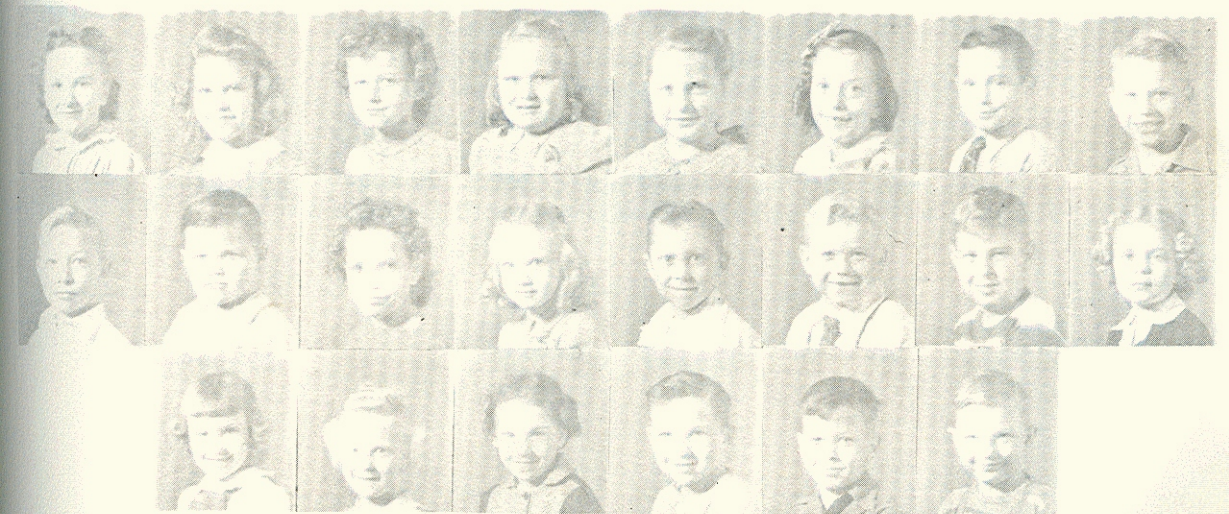
