For the third consecutive year, Bob Sevening led the Monarchs with two hundred-seventy-six points. Other team members scored as follows: Warren Melvin, two hundred-twenty-three; Richard Kirsch, one hundred eighty-three; Buddy Welch, ninety-five; Pete Ogan, sixty-six; Laton Gross, nineteen; Francis Griffen, nineteen; Roger Bartlett, sixteen; James Burley, eleven; Morry Eckman, two. This gives the Monarchs a total of nine hundred-twenty-seven points over their opponent's eight hundred and one points.

During the season, the Monarchs won thirteen and lost eight for a seasonal average of six hundred-nineteen. The season opened with an easy win over the Pierre Indians, but St. Lawrence turned the heat on and handed the boys an early season loss. The season ended with Blunt in third place behind Harrold and St. Lawrence.

Next year, the Monarchs will start without three Seniors of this year: Bob Sevening, Warren Melvin, and Pete Ogan. In the three years of basketball with the Monarchs, Bob Sevening scored a total of eight hundred and seventy-eight points. Warren Melvin scored three hundred and eighty points in his two years at Blunt and Pete Ogan scored one hundred and sixteen for his three years of play.

## AGAR INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENT

Agar played host to Blunt, Onida, and Harrold in a four team invitational tournament December 21st and 22nd, 1949. In the first game, Agar overpowered the Monarchs by a score of forty-seven to thirty-three. Onida came back the next night and proved Blunt to be the fourth place team of the tournament to the tune of forty-four to twenty-nine. Agar went on to beat Harrold for the championship.

## LITTLE CENTRAL CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

On January 20th and 21st, 1950, members of the Little Central Athletic Conference met at Ft. Pierre for their annual basketball tournament. The Monarchs drew a bye to play the winner of the Pierre Indian, Ree Heights game. Ree Heights fell at the hands of the Monarchs by a score of sixty-four to thirty-two. In the other bracket, Agar won out over St. Lawrence and Harrold to meet Blunt for championship. In one of the most exciting games of the season for the Monarchs, Blunt overpowered the Pointers forty to thirty-nine bringing home the first Conference Championship in the History of Blunt High School. Bob Sevening starred for Blunt scoring twenty-three points and playing a top-notch defensive game. Taylor led Agar with fourteen points.

## DISTRICT "16" TOURNAMENT

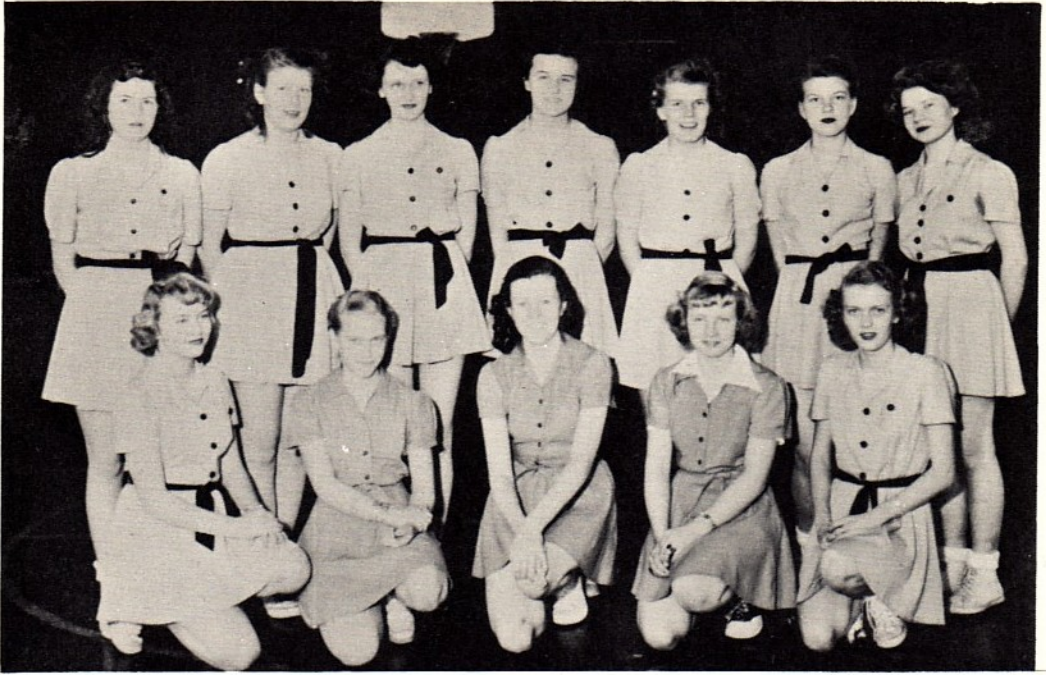
The annual South Dakota District #16 Tournament was held at Gettysburg, February 23rd through 25th, 1950. The Blunt Monarchs and the Pierre Indians opened the tournament Thursday evening, Blunt overpowering the Indians fifty-six to eighteen. The next day, Agar turned the tables on the Monarchs and handed them a forty-five to thirty-five beating. This defeat put Blunt out of the running. Friday evening, Agar fell at the hands of the Gettysburg Battlers who earned their place in the championship game. In the other bracket, Cheyenne nosed out Harrold by one point to meet Gettysburg for the championship. Gettysburg proved too powerful for the Indians and represented the district in the regional tournament.

Gettysburg again proved powerful as they won their two regional games and went on to Aberdeen to play in the State Tournament. After taking a close game from Sisseton in the semi-finals, Gettysburg finally fell in defeat by a strong Emery quintet.

## *Jr. High Tournament*

An invitational basketball tournament for members of the seventh, eighth, and ninth grades was held at Agar, March 21st and 22nd, 1950. Blunt defeated Gettysburg in the consolation semi-finals to the tune of twenty-seven to twenty-one. The Jr. Monarchs trounced Onida thirty-two to seventeen in the consolation final. Blunt placed twelve times for their thirty and one half points. Blunt winners were as follows:

In a preliminary run, Bob set a new record of twenty-five and three tenths. Eugene Warriner, Shot Put.

### Third Place:

Bob Sevening, Broad Jump, and one-hundred Yard Dash.

Francis Griffen, Discus.

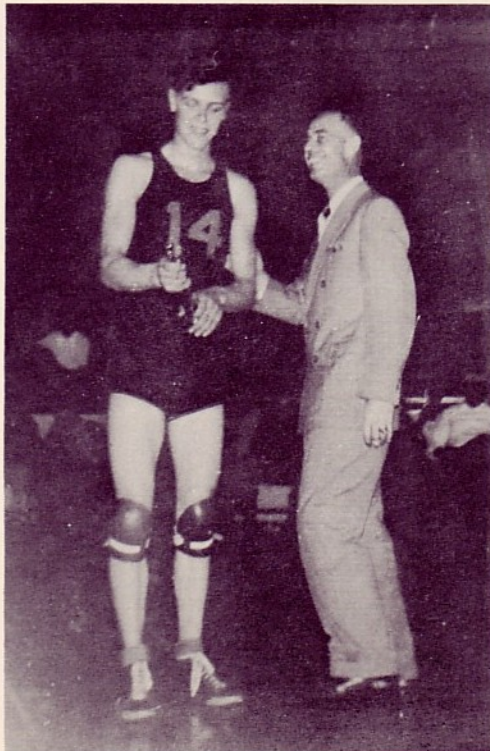

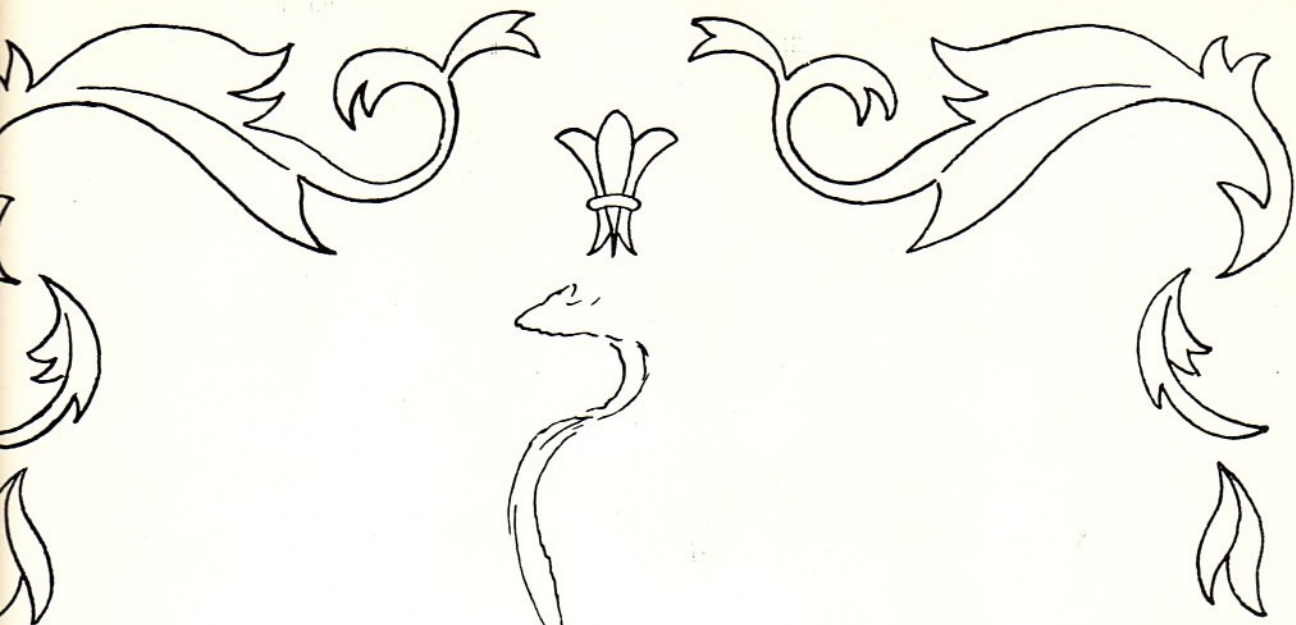

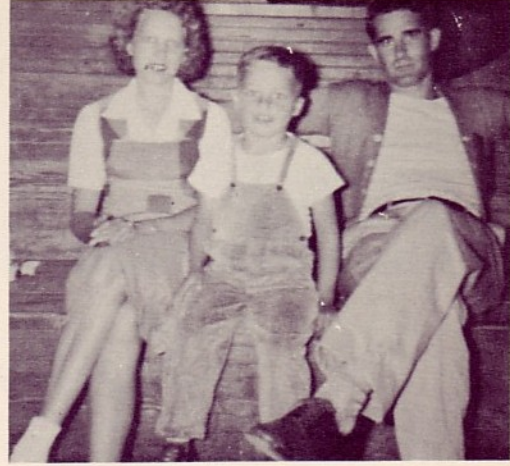
