The class colors are green and white; flower, American Beauty Rose; and motto, "CONQUER TEMPTATION THOUGH IT BE EVER SO POWERFUL."

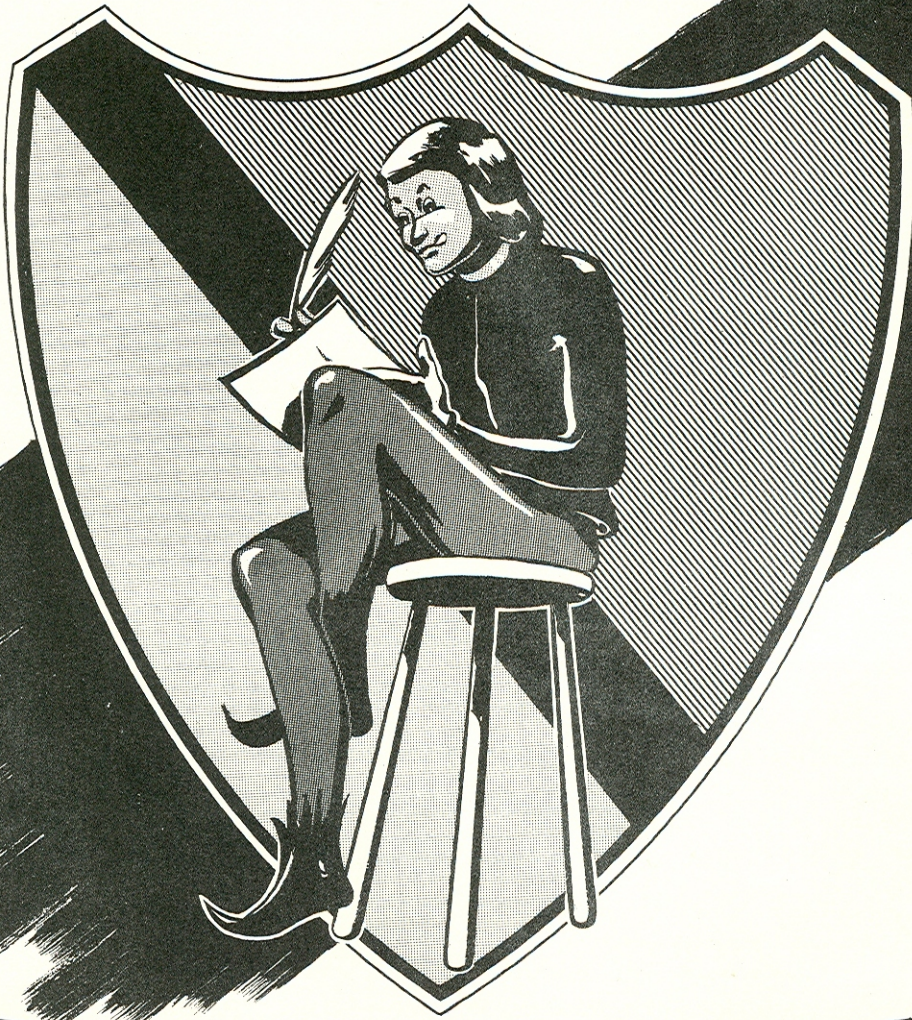
Joann Gunsalus and Harold Welch are the only Seniors who have attended all twelve years at Blunt High.

The Senior play was "We're Only Young Once," and the biggest event of the year for the Seniors was graduation.

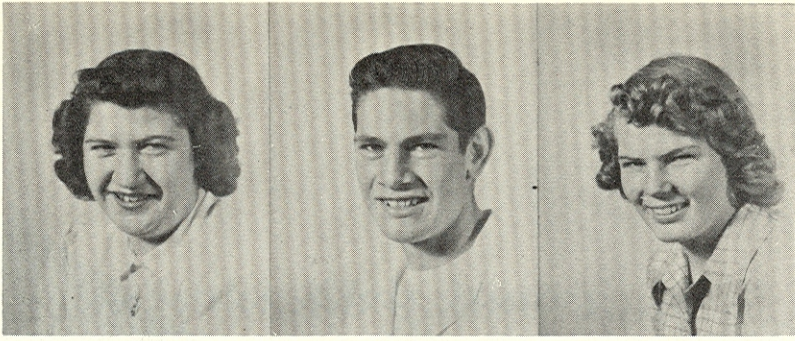
Dorothy Ping has been cheerleader for four years and Lorna Erickson for three years. Dorothy was chosen as D. A. R. Representative from Blunt High.

Peggy is valedictorian, and the salutatorian has not yet been chosen.

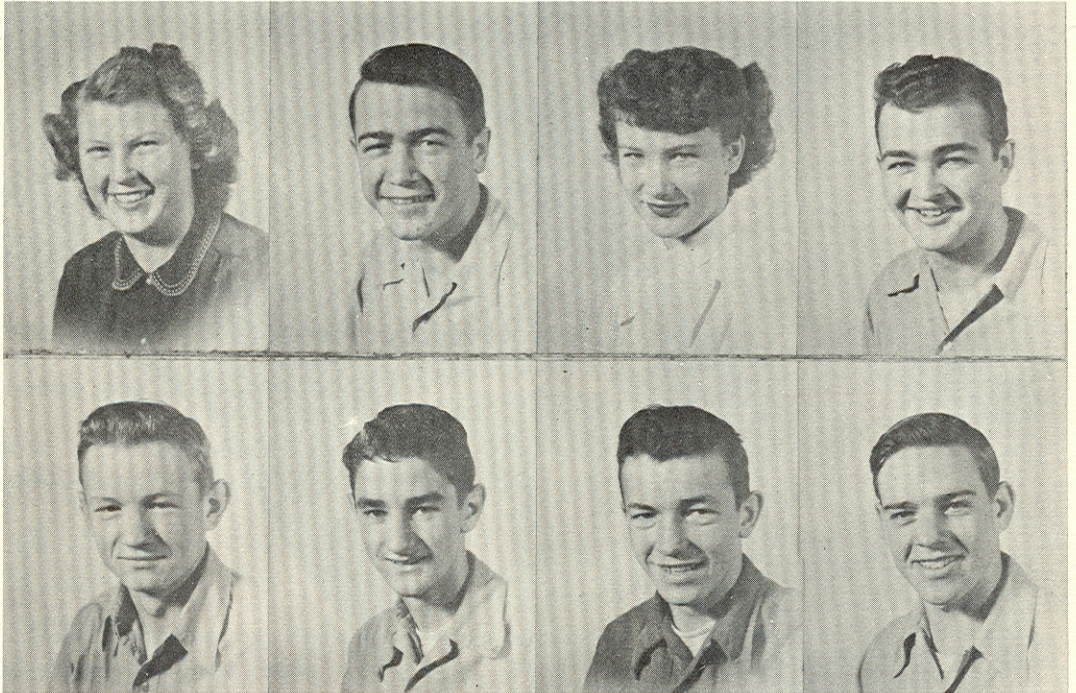

## *Gettysburg Invitational Tournament*

Gettysburg played host to Blunt, Hoven, and Selby in a four team invitational tournament January 12, 1951. Blunt lost their first game to Gettysburg by a score of fifty-three to thirty-six. In the consolation final, Blunt defeated Hoven in a real thriller, thirty-eight to thirty-six. Gettysburg won a close decision over Selby for the championship.

## *Little Central Conference Tournament*

On January 19 and 20, 1951, members of the Little Central Athletic Conference met at Fort Pierre for their annual basketball tournament. Blunt lost their first game to St. Lawrence by a score of sixty-six to fifty-two.

In their first consolation game, Blunt was victorious over Ree Heights by a score of fifty-six to fifty-one. Blunt went on to annex the consolation championship by defeating Vivian in the consolation finals fifty-one to thirty-seven. Harold Welch scored twenty-one points and Richard Kirsch scored twenty to lead their team to victory.

## *District "16" Tournament*

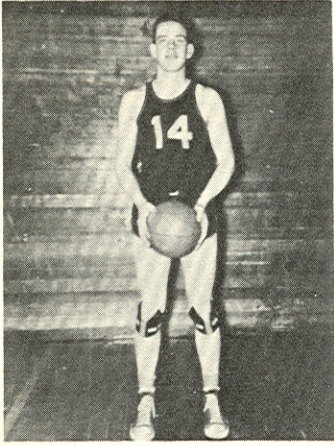
The annual District "16" Tournament was held at Fort Pierre February 23rd and at the Pierre Auditorium February 24th. In their opening game, Blunt lost the decision to Gettysburg forty-nine to thirty-eight in a game that was close all the way until the last three minutes of play. In the consolation finals, Blunt lost to Onida by a score of sixty-two to forty.

## *Monarchs*

During the past basketball season, Blunt played a total of thirty games, winning ten and losing twenty for an average of three hundred thirty-three.

The leading scorer for the year was Richard Kirsch with a total of four hundred sixty-one points. Other team members scored as follows: Harold Welch, four hundred forty-one; Buddy Welch, two hundred eighty-three; Roger Bartlett, one hundred two; Morry Eckman, seventy-seven; Jim Burley, thirty-five; and Larry Osterkamp, three. The Monarchs scored a total of fourteen hundred four points and opponents scored sixteen hundred three points for the year.

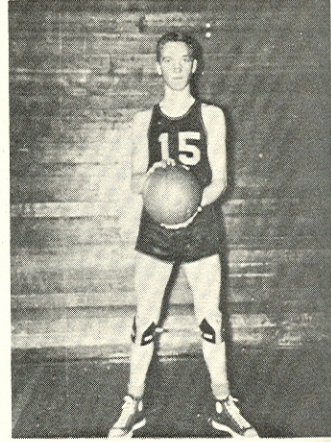

## 1950-51 Canaries

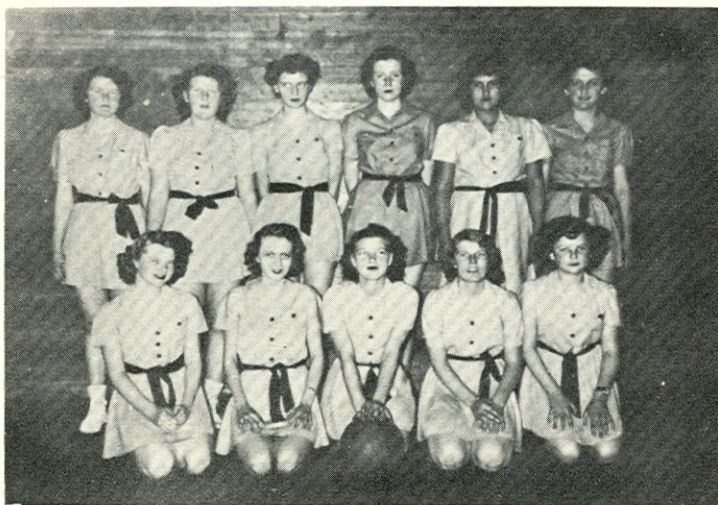
