 "This cruise seems awful stupid to me."

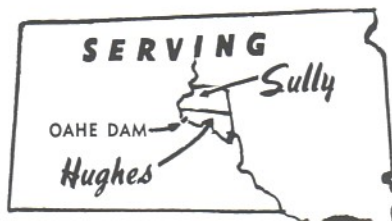
Wiping her apron as she ran,

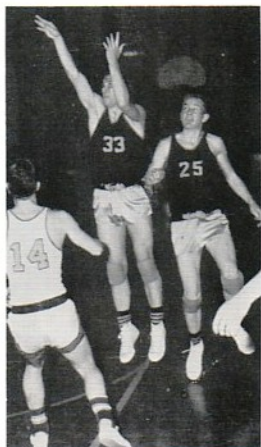

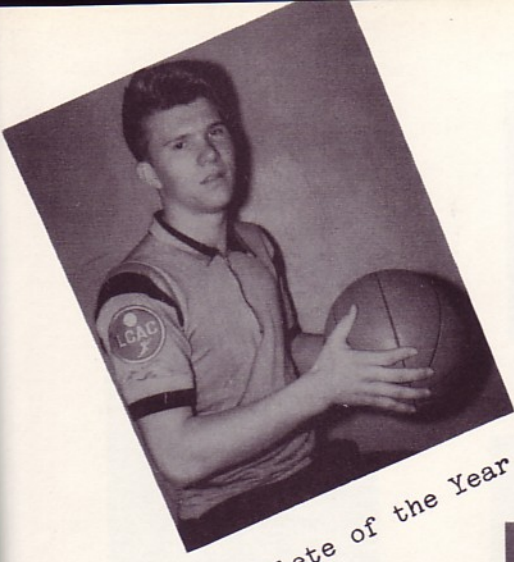

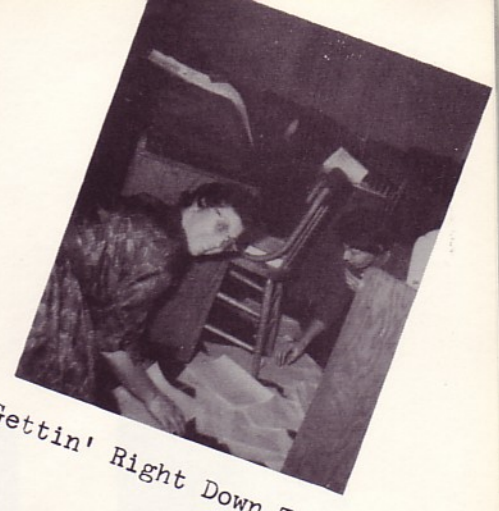
