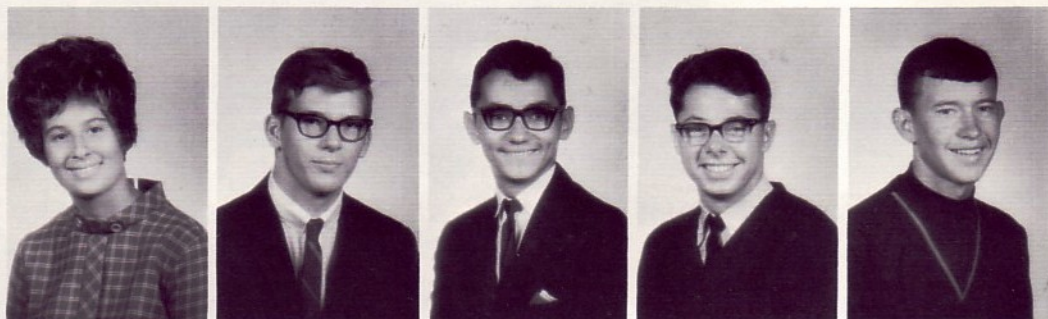


Junior - Senior Banquet

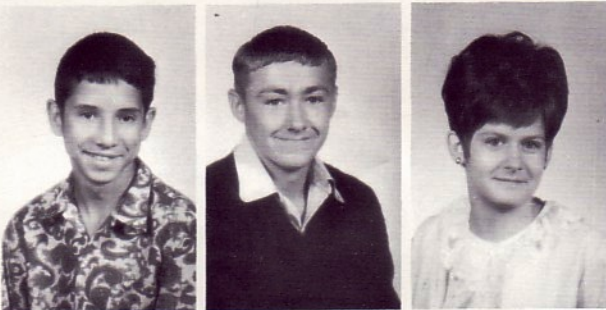

Blunt B's Win 13, Lose Five

Coach Ron Baseley's Monarch "B" team enjoyed a successful season of 13 victories and five losses. In the LCAC the team had a 3-2 record, losing only to the two teams above them in the final standings, Onida and Agar. Two of the other losses---to the Pierre Indians and the Stephan Sophomores---were later avenged. The fifth defeat came at the hands of Wolsey.

Among the most impressive victories of the winter were those over Harrold, Highmore, Canova, Wessington, and Wall. Coach Baseley used a combination of Randy Harkless, Ed Welch, Rich Doyle, Buddy King, Harry Kimbley, Les Sevensing, Jon Kirsch, and Mike Ogan most often during the season.

Blunt High's best basketball season ever opened traditionally at Onida. The Monarchs led by eight in the third quarter but succumbed to foul trouble. They then won five straight handily. The Kadoka game at Philip was the most dramatic of the year, Blunt losing to the fourth-ranked Kougars in the last second of the second overtime. BHS rolled over Highmore and Agar to open the LCAC tourney, the first win over Agar since 1950, and lost to Onida in the finals. From that night on, Blunt won 13 in a row---an impressive win at the Huron Arena against Forestburg, another win over Agar, and a southeastern road trip during which the Monarchs survived Canova's 75% shooting to come from 11 points behind and win by three, followed the next night by an exciting and beautifully played game with Bridgewater at the Mitchell Corn Palace in which Blunt handed the Wildcats their third loss in 18 games. The regular season ended with BHS beating Ft. Pierre to clinch second place in the LCAC with a 4-1 conference mark.

The District 16 tourney opened with Blunt battling an improved Sunshine team which rallied from 13 down with 3½ minutes left to within four with 35 seconds

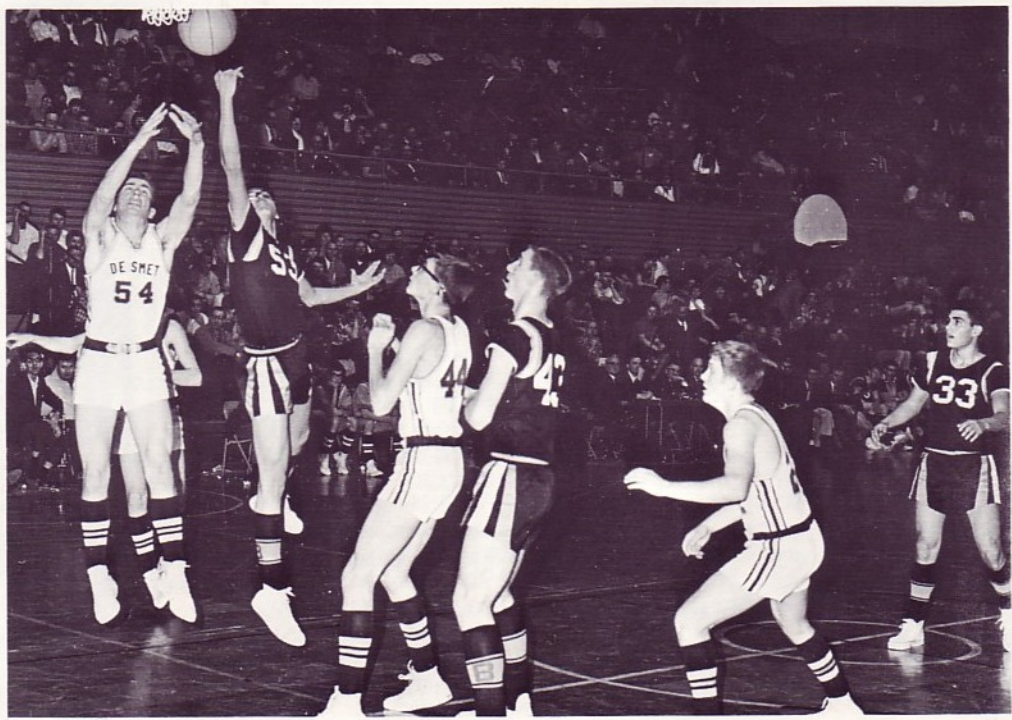
left. Despite a cold night Blunt made 28 of 39 free throws. In the semifinals the Monarchs trailed 34-29 at the half but outscored Highmore 15-2 to take command in the third period. Joe Junkman had 31 points; Massey, Howard, and Harkless 12 each. And then came the "game of the year" for the district title. Blunt moved out to a 35-22 lead over Wessington in the third period, but the Warriors rallied to within 38-34 with 5:12 to go in the game. From this point Gale Harkless sank eight free throws without missing, and BHS won it, 50-39. Junkman had 19 points, Harkless 11, and Howard ten.

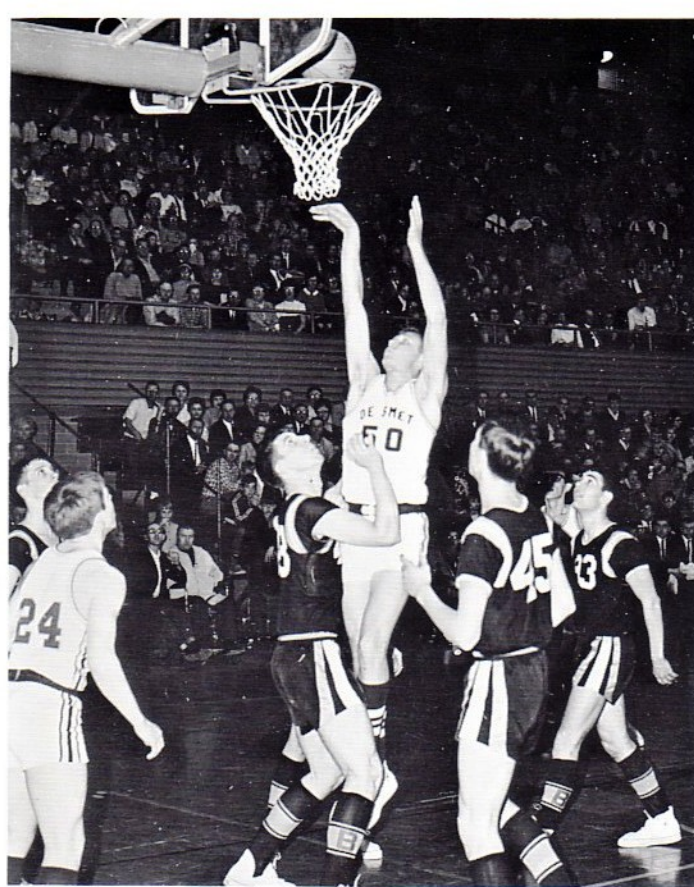
In the Region 4 tourney Blunt fell to DeSmet and then was edged by Doland in the game for third place to end a brilliant 21-5 season.

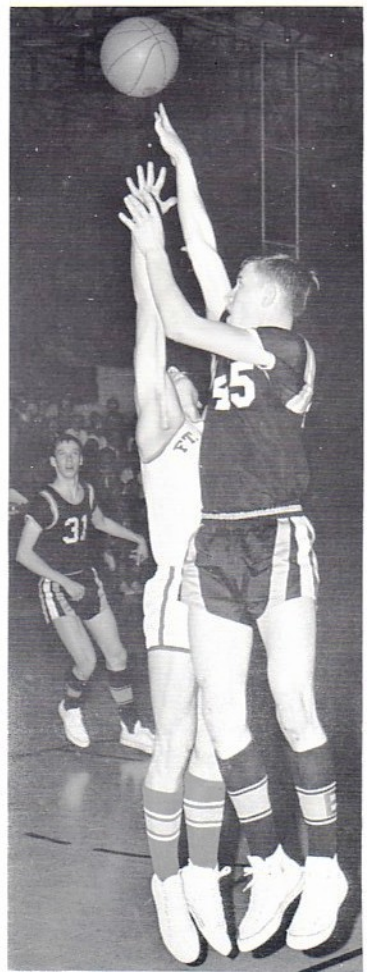


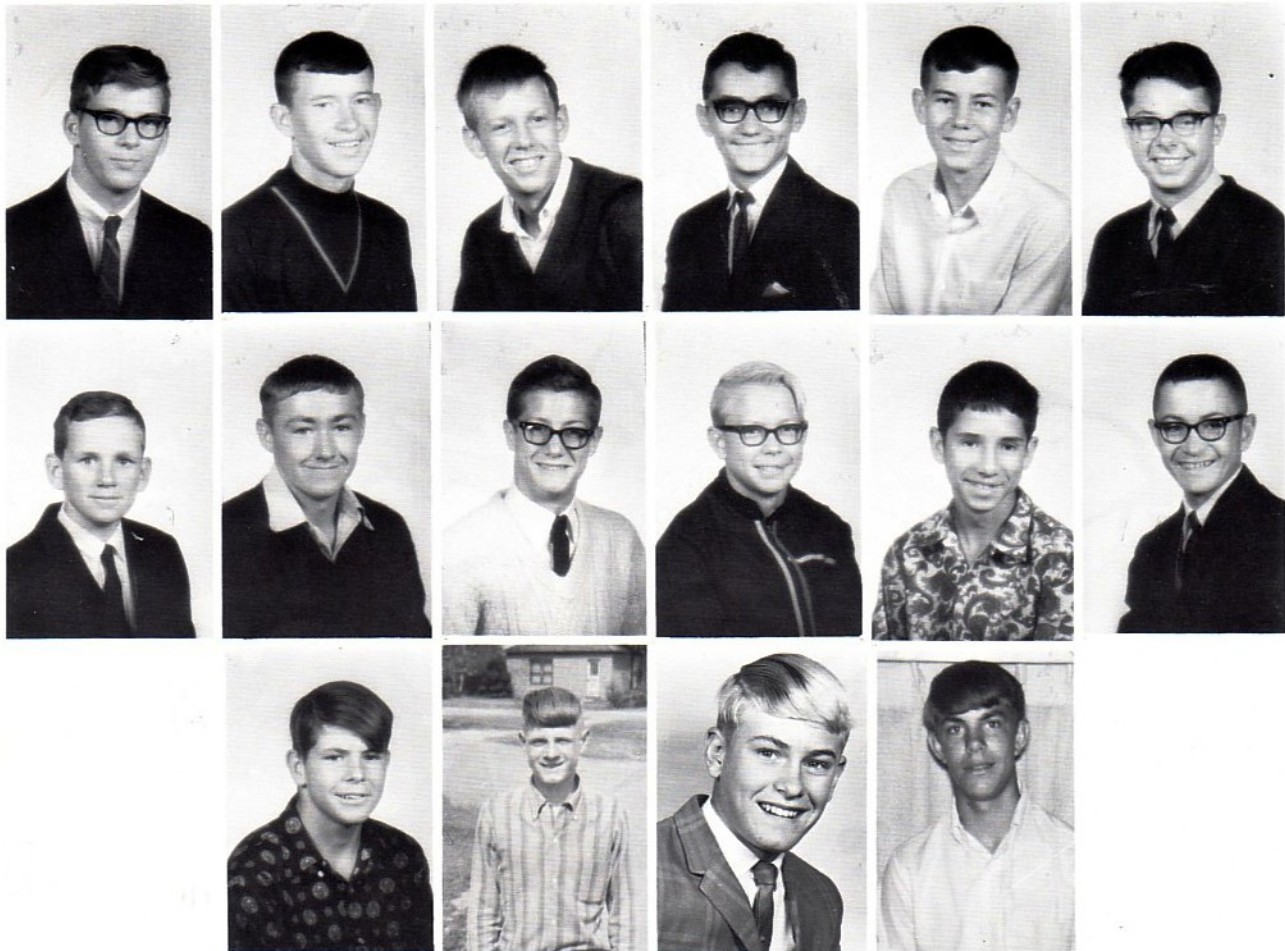

Track

For the second year in a row Tim Hubbard represented Blunt High in the state track meet at Sioux Falls.

At the Region IV meet in Huron on May 10, Hubbard qualified for the state in the 440-yard dash and the 880-yard run. At the state meet he set a new school record in the preliminaries of the 880 to qualify for the finals.

The Monarch track squad of 1968 set seven new school records. The team was made up of one junior along with several promising freshmen and sophomores.

Hubbard's new mark in the 880 was 2:03.9. Ted Massey ran the mile in the record time of 4:56.8. Buddy King set

new BHS times in the junior high shot put (38'1") and the two-mile run (11:43.3). The 880 relay team of Harry Kimbley, Les Sevening, Ed Welch, and Hubbard set a record of 1:42.7. In the medley relay the record time by Kimbley, Sevening, Hubbard, and Rich Doyle was 4:12.2. The mile relay foursome of Kimbley, Massey, Welch, and Hubbard set a mark of 3:50.0.

In the LCAC meet on April 29, Blunt placed fifth. Hubbard was conference champion in the 440 on a time of :53.5. Blunt was fourth in points in the junior high division of the meet.

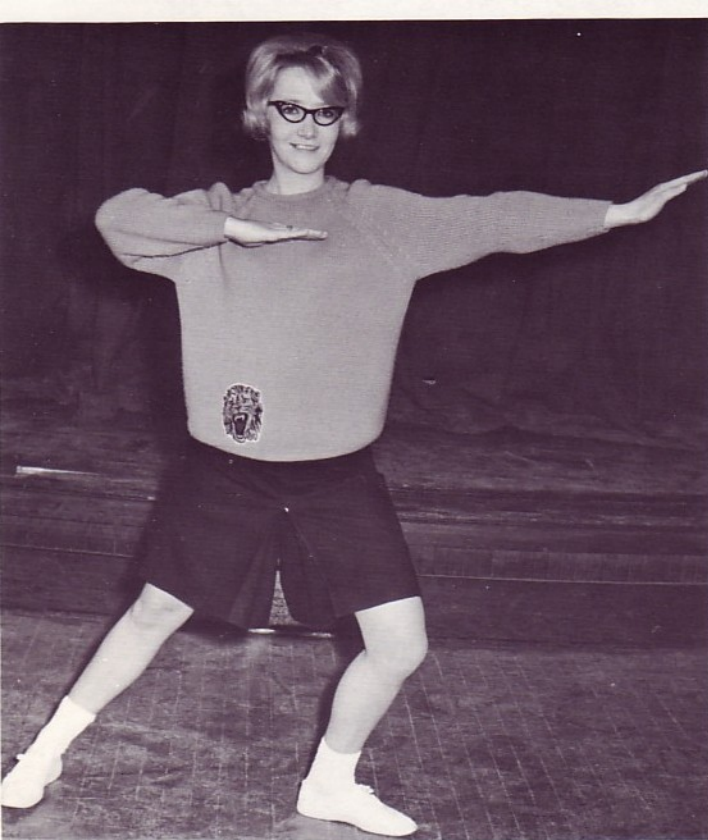

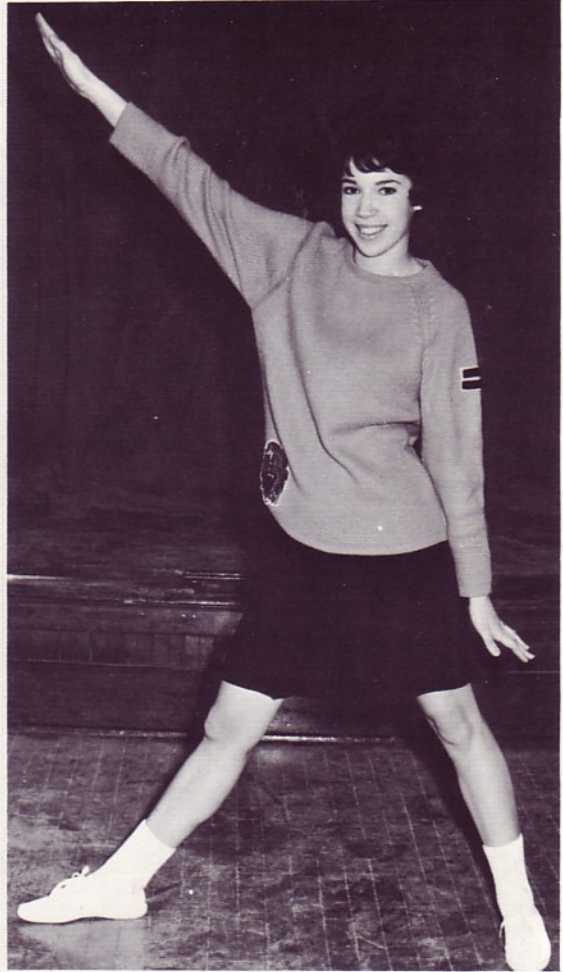
