Lyndon B. Johnson, Texas Schoolteacher To President Of U.S.

Over 2 Million Visit John F. Kennedy's Final Resting Place

AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI)—High-pan and Germany, Lyndon B. Johnson, the life of President Johnson. He was first elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1949, and served until 1961. He was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1961 and served until 1963. He was elected President of the United States in 1963.

1908—Born Aug. 27, near Johnson City, Tex., eldest son of Samuel Ealy Johnson Jr., a schoolteacher, and member of the Texas Legislature, and Rebecca Baines Johnson.

1913—Entered public school at Johnson City, was graduated in spring of 1924.

1924—Began work at \$1 per day on a road-building gang. Had urge to travel and wanted to see the West. Worked way to California.

1928—Had to leave job teaching school at Tulia, Tex. Used first pay check to buy athletic equipment for underprivileged Latin American children.

1928—Returned to college. Took Texas State in August.

1932—Went to Washington, D.C., as secretary to Rep. Richard Kleberg, D-Tex., remaining in that post until 1935.

1934—Married Claudia (Lady Bird) Taylor on Nov. 17. Attended night school at Georgetown, D.C., law school.

1935—Named Texas administrator of the National Youth Administration by President Roosevelt.

1935—Successfully sought 10th seat without opposition in retaining Democratic leadership in House.

1941—Sought seat in Morris Sheppard district, W. Lee (Pappy) Lee defeated by 1,311 votes.

1941—Withdrawing vote to

1953—Named minority leader when Democrats lost control of Senate by a single vote.

1954—Re-elected to U.S. Senate for second term.

1956—Southern Democrats launched a drive to win presidential nomination for Johnson at national convention.

1957—Steered through passage of first civil rights bill in 75 years.

1958—President Johnson invited United Nations to call for a "peaceful exploration" of outer space.

1959—Texas Legislature called "Johnson bill," a statute aimed to have name on ballot for re-election at same time.

1960—Lost vice presidency to John F. Kennedy.

1961—Elected President of the United States.

1963—Assassinated in Dallas.

Highlights Of Career Of President Kennedy

WASHINGTON (UPI)— Highlights of President Kennedy's career:

- May 29, 1917—Born in Brookline, Mass., the second of nine children of former Ambassador Joseph P. Kennedy and his wife, Rose.
- Graduated from Harvard with a bachelor's degree.
- Published best selling "Why England Slept."
- Served in the U.S. Navy to rank of lieutenant.
- Badly injured when a PT boat was rammed by a German submarine.
- 1947-1953 — Congressman from Massachusetts.
- 1952—Elected to the Senate, defeating Republican Henry Cabot Lodge.
- 1953—Married Jacqueline Bouvier in Newport, Rhode Island.
- 1953-1955—Spent six months in hospital undergoing major surgery on a back injury aggravated by the sinking of his PT boat.
- 1956—Won a Pulitzer Prize for his book "Profiles in Courage."
- 1956—Narrowly missed winning the Democratic vice presidential nomination, losing in a close contest to the late Sen. Estes Kefauver, D-Tenn.
- 1957—Became the father of his first child, Caroline.
- 1958—Won re-election to the Senate by an overwhelming margin.
- 1960—On July 14, he won the Democratic presidential nomination on the first ballot.
- 1960—In November he defeated Nixon for the presidency in a close-fought battle that gave Kennedy a final edge of scarcely 100,000 ballots.
- 1961—Became the father of a son, John Jr.
- 1961—In April took full responsibility for the ill-fated Cuban invasion staged by dissident exile groups.
- 1962—In October forced Russia to withdraw missiles it had secreted in Cuba.
- 1963—Assassinated Nov. 22.

Russia Receives Wheat

MOSCOW (UPI)— The first shipment of Canadian wheat to reach the Soviet Union was on its way to consumers today. There were reports that cattle were being slaughtered in farm areas short of fodder. The government newspaper Izvestia reported the arrival of the first 21,000 tons of Canadian wheat unloaded in 71 hours instead of the 21 days it normally takes to unload such a shipment. The wheat is part of the 6.8 million tons bought from Canada for \$500 million because of large-scale crop failures in the Soviet Union. Talks are being held for sales of \$250 million more from the United States and Australia already has sold \$100 million worth to Russia. Another 50,000 tons of Canadian wheat was expected in the Sea port of Odessa in
