# Dedication

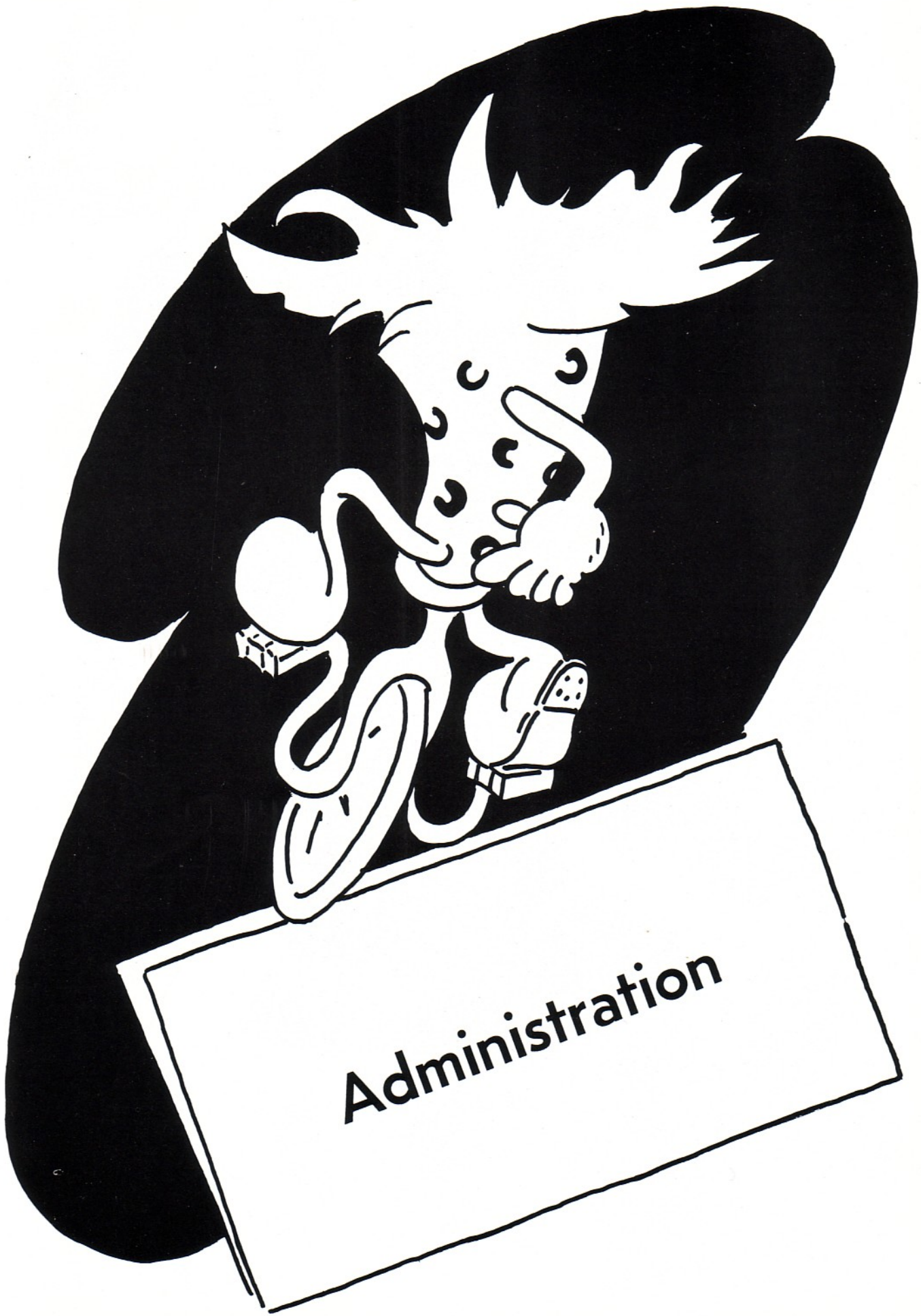


What does the position of school custodian require of a man?
